



Packing List

What to bring

- prescription medications along with Medication Form
- sleeping bag
- pillow
- battery operated alarm clock
- watch
- Bible, pens and notebook
- sunblock (the higher SPF, the better)
- water bottle
- pre-addressed/stamped envelope and stationery
- sneakers and casual shoes
- shorts
- pants
- shirts
- socks and underwear
- pajamas
- light sweatshirt or jacket (Indoors with AC can be quite chilly)
- toiletries
- towels (1 for shower and 1 for pool)
- swimsuit (girls: one piece; guys: the pool we are going to requires real swimsuits not gym shorts and no speedos)
- flip flops for shower and pool
- a red and blue outfit for team games

Male dress code

- No underwear showing
- No crude shirts
- No super tight jeans
- Swimsuits: no bikini style trunks (i.e. Speedo)
- With all clothing, no stomach showing (except swimming of course), no backsides showing
- No suggestive or inappropriate clothing

Female dress code

- Tank tops: two finger width straps
- Skirts knee-length
- Shorts no more than five inches above the knee
- Swimsuits: one piece
- No crude shirts
- With all clothing, no low shirts, no stomach showing, no backsides showing No suggestive or inappropriate clothing
